Blessing of Homes with Easter Water

Instruction:

Gather the members of the household together for a moment.

You will need to....

- Have one household member to Lead the prayer
- Another will be required to read the Reading 2 Chron 7:15-16
- A third participant will make a sign of the cross with the water, which was pre-blessed during the Easter Triduum
- Invite to all who are present to prepare a personal intercession before the Home Blessing begins (if they are happy to do so)
- All of the above roles can also be led by one individual



Gathering Prayer:

Leader - Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of our home. We gather here today to celebrate and welcome your presence here amongst us in our dwelling place. May your blessings continue to pour down upon this home and upon all who are gathered here; that our home may be enriched with love, memories, grace and peace.

Reading: 2 Chronicles 7:15-16

Reader - "Now my eyes will be open and my ears attentive to the prayer that is made in this place. For now I have chosen and consecrated this house that my name may be there forever. My eyes and my heart will be there for all time."

The Word of the Lord All: Thanks be to God

Personal Intercession:

All – Invite each participant to offer a prayerful intention which they will have had time to prepare before the blessing began. Remember to pray for deceased family members and for real hopes, fears and joys that relate to those who have gathered and with whom you share your home.

Blessing:

Leader – Let us now pray that the Lord will enter our home and bless it with his presence.

May the lord always be here among us, deepen our love for each other, share in our joys, and comfort us in our sorrows.

May our home be a place of love, Filled with the goodness of the Lord. Amen

Begin Making a Sign of the Cross

We bless this house In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen



The remaining Blessed Water can be used in a Holy Water font or kept within a sacred space in the home.

Conclude with official prayer for the World Meeting of Families
